The Bristol Commons Community Garden is open for its third year. The Garden was funded through the HOPE VI grant and we are really excited about this venture.

This includes attending the organizational meeting and spring and fall work sessions, and assisting in tasks such as mowing, weeding, and repairs. Rules & Regulations

These Rules & Regulations will help ensure that everyone using the garden will have a productive and enjoyable experience. Applications will be available at HOPE VI CSS Office, 101 Fairground Avenue, Taunton, MA 02780 and on Facebook at 'Bristol Commons Garden'.

General Requirements:

Gardeners must follow all local, state and federal laws. Gardeners agree to hold the Taunton Housing Authority and/or Trinity Management harmless for any and all liability that may be incurred by themselves or third parties as a result of the use of the premises. The gardener accepts the risk of loss.

1. Failure to comply with these Rules & Regulations may result in the loss of gardening privileges, including loss of the assigned plot.
2. The garden area is open seven days a week.
3. Garden plots are temporary fixtures. The Taunton Housing Authority and/or Trinity Management reserve the right to relocate or remove the garden or any plots at the end of the season.
4. No pets are allowed in the Garden.
5. Gardeners will park in designated parking areas and not drive vehicles into the garden.

Gardening Requirements:

1. No chemical pesticides or herbicides may be applied. Use products labeled "For Organic Gardening."
2. Any mulching material must be biodegradable
3. No materials of any type shall be applied in a manner that affects adjacent garden areas.
4. By June 25, if a reserved plot does not show clear evidence of active gardening, the plot may be reassigned. Abandoned plots will be reassigned and treated as necessary.
5. No motorized equipment shall be used in the garden before 9:00 a.m. Mon-Sat, 10:00 a.m. on Sundays.
6. Amplified sound is not permitted. If you wish to listen to music or a radio, use headphones.
7. No planting of invasive, illegal or poisonous plants. Mint plants should be planted in pots so to avoid taking over.
8. Rotting and spoiled produce, must be placed in the compost bin to alleviate risk of pests. Plots with a substantial amount of rotted or overgrown produce will be considered abandoned and confiscated.
9. No permanent fixtures may be installed. Temporary seasonal fences may be installed in a manner that will not trap birds or insects; for instance, fencing will not be doubled over. Fencing material shall be black, earth tone or natural color to reduce visibility. Fencing and vegetation supports will be traditional cages, stakes, strings and ties. Installed supports may not exceed 60 inches in height. Stakes must be green painted metal, made of wood or wood type products in a natural or earth-tone color.
10. Water will be provided via a Garden Hose. Gardeners should provide their own watering cans, a few watering cans will be available in the shed. Hoses are to be returned to spout or on the hose hideaway.
11. Place all weed, plant residue in designated compost area. Place all trash and litter in designated waste container or taken away with you. Do not leave any trash in the garden.
12. Any debris and trash, other than compost materials, will be carried out at the end of the day. Personal items, other than gardening hand tools and water buckets to be stored on the plot, will be removed at the end of the day.
13. By October 9th, each gardener must clear all corner stakes, fencing, trellises, string and all inorganic material. Any vines or large plants shall be chopped so a cover crop can be planted.
